To Our Residents and Businesses,

All of us at the Village of Woodlawn hope you had a wonderful Holiday Season. As 2024 begins we are excited to continue our momentum from 2023.

I want to begin by thanking our Public Works crew for their efforts to keep the roads clear of ice the past few weeks. While there hasn't been a lot of icy weather; the team has come in the past few weekends at early hours to make sure the roads were treated and that our residents, businesses, and others that traverse our Village could do so safely. Unlike our safety services teams, Public Works is not a 24/7 group; they work regular weekday hours. Any time the Public Works team spends on the roads during winter evenings and weekends takes away from their family time and we appreciate their commitment to the Village.

Please note that the Village Council voted to establish a school zone on Glendale Milford and Chester Road as a safety measure for students attending IDEA Academy (the old Brown Mackie Building). Soon the appropriate school zone signage and lights will be installed, and our Village Police Department will enforce the speed. Please be cognizant of this change as you travel Glendale Milford and Chester Road during restricted hours.

The Village is hosting Neighborhood Allies at the Village of Woodlawn Recreations Center the second Friday of each month at 11 o'clock. Neighborhood Allies is a non-for-profit organization that bridges the gap between government services and those in need. The group assists individuals in finding assistance services as well as obtaining and filling out the appropriate documents. Neighborhood Allies also offers assistance with record expungement, obtaining State ID's, registering to vote, and mental health services. The Village paused the improvements to Ronnie Road and Woodstock Drive for the winter. While we had hoped to complete the project before winter, additional work was added to the project and the cold weather made it impossible to complete the final tasks including the addition of the final layer of asphalt. The project will recommence in the spring when the weather is a little warmer and we all look forward to its completion in 2024. We want to thank all the residents of Ronnie and Woodstock for their continued patience; construction is never convenient, and they've been most gracious through this process.

The improvements to Ronnie and Woodstock have been made possible by the 0.3% income tax the Village residents voted for in 2018. This income tax expired on December 31 of 2023 and was replaced with a new 0.3% income tax passed by the Village residents as part of the 2023 election. This new tax will last for five vears and will continue to fund road improvements but can also be used for new sidewalk improvements. This change allows the Village to better pursue grants for capital improvements from State and Federal Agencies as both generally require (or strongly recommend) that local funds match any grant funds at a rate of ten to thirty percent of the grant award amount.

The Village will continue road improvements in 2024. The Village will bid out improvements to Redna Terrace and Chester Road at the end of January with construction to begin in the Spring. These improvements will be funded through sources obtained in 2023 which include an OPWC grant of \$1,059,000, a \$100,000 grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation along with a matching interest free OPWC loan of \$1,059,000.

The Village is also planning to bid out improvements to Leacrest Road this year, which will be funded through a 2023 interest free loan

from the Ohio Public Works Commission of \$1,119,900. Finally, the Village will bid out sidewalk improvements to Springfield Pike and Grueninger Way this year. These improvements will be made, mostly, through a 2023 grant of \$1,200,000 from the Southwest Ohio Regional Transit Authority (SORTA). As you may recall from the previous newsletter, along with some road improvements, this project will include new sidewalks on the East side of Springfield Pike that will run from Grueninger Way to the bus stop at Goodwill.

The Village was also awarded a grant in the amount of \$470,000 from SORTA late last year. This grant will be used to add sidewalks to the south side of Glendale Milford Road beginning at Chester Road and ending at Wayne Ave (construction likely to begin in 2025).

**Woodlawn Fire Department Winter Weather Tips:** 

The Woodlawn Fire Department (WFD) would like to remind residents to stay safe during severely cold weather.

Since the severe weather impacts response times as firefighters compete with adverse weather and road conditions.

### To aid in their response efforts, the WFD is asking residents to please:

- Clear snow form around fire hydrants to allow the fire fighters better access.
- Clear a path to your front door.
- Make sure your house address numbers remain visible and are not blocked by snow.
- When driving, make sure to leave room for emergency vehicles to pass-go right for sirens and lights.
- Check on elderly friends and neighbors and lend them a hand.
- Dress appropriately when outside add layers of clothing.
- Have a winter emergency kit inside your car including: jumper cables, wiper fluid, first aid kit, blanket, gloves, flashlight/flares, and some salt or kitty litter for traction.
- Only shovel snow if you are medically and physically able.

Greetings Woodlawn residents – this is YOUR new Police Chief, Kevin Williams! I want to start off by thanking everyone for all the love and support that you have given me in my new role with the Village. I am a lifelong resident of Woodlawn, and my father, former Police Chief John Williams, served in this same role for 22 years. So not only do I have big shoes to fill, but I also have a vested interest in forming bonds with our residents and keeping our community safe.

For those residents who may be unaware, there has been an increase in thefts in our Village,



both from vehicles and from homes. Most of these incidents are crimes of opportunity, so please be sure that the doors to your vehicles AND homes are locked both at night, and when you're away from home. Another great tool in combatting thefts, vandalism, and criminal mischief incidents is for us to turn on our outdoor lights in the evenings. Lighted properties and

properties with motion lights are less likely to be targeted by thieves and criminals.

Some of you may have noticed individuals going door to door stating that they are representatives of Duke Energy; Verizon Wireless; etc. Those individuals need to have a solicitor's permit on file with the Village prior to going door to door in our neighborhood.
