



From the Village Manager’s Desk

To Our Residents and Businesses,

Spring is upon us and as flowers begin to bloom and the days get longer more changes are taking place in the Village of Woodlawn!

First, I would like to recognize our new Finance Director, Loren S. Crisp, who officially joined the Village in late February this year. Lonny brings more than 40 years of experience to the Village of Woodlawn; 25 of which were spent at the Ohio Auditor of State’s Office as the Regional Chief Auditor of the Southwest Region of Ohio. This experience, coupled with his time spent as Director of Financial Operations at Clermont County, Manager of Governmental Consulting at Ernst and Young, and Chief Accountant at Lucas County have raised the professional standards in the Village Finance Department to a level that can’t be matched by most major cities. I can honestly say that the Village’s finances have never been in better hands.

The Village will host its annual Juneteenth celebration on June 19th this year. New features to the celebration will include a Juneteenth Museum as well as Underground Railroad Tours. The Museum will contain artwork and artifacts loaned to the event coordinator; some of these items have been provided or are related to local residents. The Underground Railroad Tours are local tours facilitated through the Eckstein Community Center (Glendale) and Landmark Church. Buses will depart Woodlawn at various times during the event to view local Underground Railroad sites which include sites on the Landmark Church Property that are normally closed to the public. This is an amazing educational addition to our Celebration, and we want to be sure to thank Bill Parrish from the Eckstein Center, Landmark Church, and our partners at Call A Play Athletics for making this possible.

Public Works performed a major cleanup of the wooded area behind Harmony Park. The area looks tremendously better than it has in several years and I want to make sure to thank Director Banks, Assistant Director Weaver, and the entire public works staff for all their hard work.

Please note that the Village Council voted to establish a school zone on Glendale Milford and Chester Road as a safety measure for students attending IDEA Academy (the old Brown Mackie Building). Soon the appropriate school zone signage and lights will be installed, and our Village Police Department will enforce the speed. Please be cognizant of this change as you travel Glendale Milford and Chester Road during restricted hours.

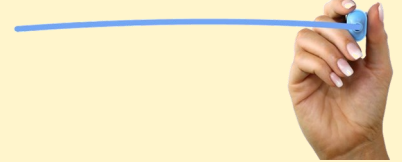

The Village paused the improvements to Ronnie Road and Woodstock Drive for the winter last year. While we had hoped to complete the project before winter, additional work was added to the project and the cold weather made it impossible to complete the final tasks including the addition of the final layer of asphalt. The project will recommence the week of April 26th and the next layer of asphalt will be put down on Ronnie and Woodstock during the first week of May (weather permitting). The Village is also planning on adding river rock to the storm water swells (drainage ditches) on the sides of Ronnie and Woodstock for both safety and aesthetic reasons.

We want to thank all the residents of Ronnie and Woodstock for their continued patience; construction is never convenient, and they've been most gracious through this process.

Bids related to improvements to Redna Terrace and Chester Road were opened on February 14th, 2024; the lowest and best bidder was Adleta Construction with a bid of \$1,311,404.12. The pre-construction meeting for these improvements took place on April 10th and we will keep the residents and businesses informed as to the progress of this project. These improvements will be funded through sources obtained in 2023 which include an OPWC grant and loan as well as a grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation.



The Village will bid out sidewalk improvements to Springfield Pike and Grueninger Way this year. These improvements will be made, mostly, through a 2023 grant of \$1,200,000 from the Southwest Ohio Regional Transit Authority (SORTA). Previously, this project was to make some road improvements as well as provide new sidewalks on the East side of Springfield Pike that would run from Grueninger Way to the bus stop at Goodwill. The Village is also considering extending the project to Oak Ave. to complete sidewalks to the Woodlawn/Glendale boarder.

The Village delayed improvements to Leacrest Road until 2025. On the advice of our engineering firm, additional time will be needed as the Village is investigating the addition of storm water improvements and utility improvements as part of the project. I do want to state that the money that will fund this project cannot be used for any other purpose and these improvements will take place. As a reminder, the Leacrest improvements will be funded through a 2023 interest free loan from the Ohio Public Works Commission of \$1,119,900.

The Village was also awarded a grant in the amount of \$470,000 from SORTA late last year. This grant will be used to add sidewalks to the south side of Glendale Milford Road beginning at Chester Road and ending at Wayne Ave (construction likely to begin in 2025).

The Village will continue to pursue additional grant funding related to roads and sidewalks with the goal of improving our roads and making our Village more walkable and viable to alternative methods of transportation. As always, we are grateful to our partners at CT Consultants that provide so much assistance in securing grants and loans for infrastructure improvement projects.

2024 continues to be both busy and exciting as there are so many projects taking place and being planned. Please know that your Village Council, Administration, and all Village Departments continue to work diligently to bring additional projects and opportunities to Woodlawn. Our hope is that you continue to notice the growth and progress the Village makes and continue to be excited to live and do business in this Beautiful Woodlawn.

I want to thank everyone for the warm welcome to the Village. I work with a great team here And we all genuinely care about Woodlawn and strive daily to make it a great place to work and live. I want to address in this issue that our Village Council approved the final 2024 appropriations (operating budget) of \$8,200,888 for the General fund. This budget includes funding for the Police, Fire, Recreation, Zoning, Public Works, Mayor’s Court, Finance, Legislative, Tax and certain Debt Service payments. Final appropriations are limited by the available resources (carry forward balances plus estimated revenue). Village Departments are working diligently to provide services that enhance the safety and quality of life of Village residents.

OUR GOAL IS TO EDUCATE RESIDENTS ON THE PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE FOR THE VILLAGE OF WOODLAWN. WE WILL BE ADDRESSING VIOLATIONS SUCH AS SANITATION, LITTERING, STORAGE OF JUNK VEHICLES, HIGH GRASS, WEEDS AND EXTERIOR STRUCTURAL HAZARDS INCLUDING CARPORTS AND GARAGES. WE WILL BE GIVING WARNING CITATIONS FOR THESE VIOLATIONS AND IF THE ISSUES ARE NOT RESOLVED RESIDENTS MAY BE CITED TO COURT AND FINED.
